



## The Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time – February 8 & 9, 2025

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

As described in Isaiah's vision (Isaiah 6:1- 8) and in the call of St. Paul (I Cor 15:1-11), the Lord's invitation is a direct and personal one, meant to bring about both purification and an invitation to serve. In Isaiah's case, the touch on his lips represents a purification that allows him to speak for God. Similarly, St. Paul, though unworthy due to his past persecution of Christians, experiences the transformative grace of God, which makes him a willing servant of the Gospel.

Both Isaiah and Paul acknowledge their unworthiness when faced with the call of the Lord. This awareness of personal sin is not a barrier to God's invitation but rather a prelude to the purification that is necessary for fulfilling God's purpose. As Isaiah says, "I am a man of unclean lips," and St. Paul admits, "I am the least of the apostles," both recognizing their flaws yet experiencing the grace of God's transformation.

The key to the transformation is not just the call of God, but our willingness to respond, as seen in the story of Peter. Though he initially doubts, Peter's eventual obedience to Jesus' command leads to a miraculous catch of fish, symbolizing how obedience to God's call leads to abundance, even when human efforts fall short. This action of surrendering to God's word and allowing Him to work through us is essential for spiritual growth.

The idea that God calls the unworthy is a central theme of this reflection. By choosing figures like King David, Mary Magdalene, and even the penitent thief, the story of salvation shows that God's mercy and grace are not limited by human standards of worthiness. This gives all believers hope, as it shows that no one is beyond the reach of God's transformative love.

In the story of the miraculous catch of fish, we see how Jesus enters into the hopelessness of the disciples' situation and transforms it into a moment of abundance. (Luke 5:1-11). This is a powerful metaphor for how, when we invite Jesus into the challenges of our own lives, He can bring hope, healing, and renewal.

This Scripture reflection calls us to listen to God's invitation in our lives. Just as God purified Isaiah and Paul, and transformed Peter's doubt into faith, he invites us to surrender to his will. Despite our weaknesses, past mistakes, or doubts, God's grace is sufficient to make us new. By acting on Jesus' words, we open ourselves to his miracles and the opportunity to become witnesses of his kingdom. As he invited the disciples to follow him, so too he calls us to experience his abundant grace and share that hope with others.

**5<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time**

My parents' garage is full of old junk that no longer serves any purpose in my life. As a 46-year-old man, I admit that's pretty lame. Either due to my sentimentality or laziness (or both, probably), I just couldn't get myself to throw things away. But a few days ago, by a grace of God, I thought: "I'll hire my nephew Ryan to throw a bunch of my stuff away — he couldn't care less about my junk!" And you know what? It worked. In one day, Ryan chucked the majority of his uncle's useless stuff. I feel so free, ready for a new junk-free chapter in my life.

This kind of thing happens in this Sunday's Gospel. Peter's net is full of useless junk. Luke says he and the others are cleaning their nets after catching no fish. Imagine them dejectedly and impatiently removing a nasty assortment of seaweed, sticks and muck. The Lord teaches and calls them once their nets are cleared out. So it goes with us. Spiritual life begins by removing that which is useless and merely taking up space in our hearts, minds and lives. Then Jesus teaches and acts in a marvelous way in our lives, too.

So what's junking up your net? What habits, attachments, possessions, preoccupations? If, like me, you struggle to clean your nets by yourself, ask the Lord to send you someone like my nephew to be your "Peter" and help you clean it out. It is well worth it. Once Peter's net is clean, he is free to make a wonderful catch. — *Father John Muir*
