
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

Understanding the Holy Mass -12

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

IV. The Communion Rite (continues).

The Mingling Rite: After the priest breaks the consecrated bread, a small piece is placed into the chalice while he quietly prays: *“May this mingling of the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ bring eternal life to us who receive it.”* The separate consecration of the bread and wine during the Mass symbolizes the separation of Christ’s body and blood in His death on the cross. However, the mingling of the Body and Blood in this rite expresses their reunion in Christ’s resurrection, emphasizing that what we receive during Holy Communion is the Risen Lord.

Behold the Lamb of God: The priest invites the faithful to Holy Communion by saying: *“Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world”* (John 1:29). These words recall John the Baptist’s announcement of Jesus at the River Jordan. *“Blessed are those called to the Supper of the Lamb”* invites us to recognize that the Eucharist is not an ordinary meal, but a sacred invitation. This reflects the wedding feast of the Lamb, mentioned in the Book of Revelation: *“Blessed are those who have been called to the wedding feast of the Lamb”* (Rev 19:9). We are invited to the ultimate communion with Christ.

Lord, I am not worthy: The faithful respond: *“Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.”* This prayer expresses humility and trust, echoing the Roman centurion’s words as he sought healing for his servant (Matthew 8:8). It reflects our acknowledgment of unworthiness due to sin, yet also our trust in Jesus’ power to heal. Though *“under my roof”* may seem unusual when preparing for Communion, it signifies the idea of welcoming Jesus into the “temple” of our bodies (1 Cor 6:19), making our hearts and lives worthy of His grace. The Eucharist is true food that provides spiritual nourishment, which is why we will refer more specifically to *“my soul”* in the last line.

Receiving the Eucharist: Receiving the Eucharist is a great gift—the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. We must first examine our consciences to ensure that we are in a state of grace, free from mortal sin. St. Paul warns: *“Whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord unworthily will have to answer for the body and blood of the Lord. A person should examine himself, and so eat the bread and drink the cup. For anyone who eats and drinks without discerning the body, eats and drinks judgment on himself”* (1 Cor 11:27-29). There is also the requirement of fasting from food and drink for at least one hour before receiving Holy Communion.

Meditation: After receiving Holy Communion, it is important to pause and meditate on the spiritual fruits of the sacrament. Give thanks to the Lord for this great gift and ask for the grace to remain in intimate communion with Him.

Prayer after Communion: Following Communion, the priest offers a prayer for the spiritual fruits of the Eucharist to take root in our lives. This prayer expresses gratitude for the great gift of the Eucharist we have received. The faithful respond with “Amen,” making the prayer their own. The Communion Rite concludes with this prayer.

V. Concluding Rite:

Blessing and Dismissal: At the end of Mass, the priest blesses the congregation, invoking God’s protection and guidance. The final words of the Mass are a dismissal, which comes from the Latin word *Missa*, meaning “sending” or “dismissal.” The priest says: *“Ite, missa est,”* meaning “Go, you are dismissed” or “Go, you are sent.” This signifies the end of the Mass and our mission to go out into the world and live the gospel. Before the final blessing, the priest reminds the faithful: *“The Lord be with you.”* This is a reassurance that Christ does not leave us as orphans; He is with us always. When the priest says, *“Go in peace to love and serve the Lord,”* we are sent forth to live out our faith and proclaim the gospel throughout the week. The dismissal is not just a conclusion of the liturgy, but a commission to live out the peace and love of Christ in the world.





December 8, 2024 2nd Sunday of Advent



In the year 1995, in the seventeenth year of my life, when Fife Symington was governor of Arizona, Bill Clinton was president of the United States, Chuck Keiffer was pastor of St. Theresa parish in Phoenix, Arizona, and Ron and Mary were my parents, the word of God came to my youth minister Eric and through him I started to see the salvation of God. Soon, Christ came into my life never to leave. I'm thankful beyond words.

Why am I being so specific, you ask? Because in the Gospel this week we hear the specific names of people holding civic and religious authority in first century Palestine when **“the word of God came to John the Baptist:”** Tiberius Caesar, Pontius Pilate, Herod, Philip, Lysanias, Annas, Caiaphas, and Zechariah. All this is meant to help us see that God breaks into our *history*, into real human events. Jesus is no mere myth. He is the Word-which-breaks-in, in concrete moments, you might say. And now we anticipate his coming once again in our specific situations.

Advent challenge: Name as many civic and religious leaders who are in authority currently in your life. Now, name who the potential John the Baptists may be. A spouse? A friend? A podcaster? A work colleague who brings God's word to you? Spend a moment considering that this comprises the concrete, historical setting into which Christ wishes to come. Then, with these specifics in mind, pray: **“Come, Lord Jesus. Come.”**
